Statement of Supplemental EEO Outreach Activities:

KLRN has created two web-based resources designed for high school age students, with a job skills focus. One is an entire site www.careerfest.net designed to introduce students to career tracks with desirable in-demand jobs. Visitors to this site can see "day in the life" streaming video segments about aviation careers at Southwest Airlines, and learn about career opportunities in a total of 16 career areas. This site was implemented and is maintained by KLRN, for use by students, parents and employers in the region.

Another very engaging web resource created and maintained by the station is related to our broadcast of a program "Fresh Cuts." These programs showcase the video works created by area high school and college students, featuring the filmmakers as well as samples of their work. The companion web site has streaming media versions of the videos plus additional information about the students involved.

Both of these sites, in an entertaining and engaging way, engage students in understanding that good jobs don't "just happen" -- they are the product of training, practice and conscientious execution to meet the expectations of their employer. Although the "Fresh Cuts" project is specifically about producing media for broadcast, the Careerfest site actually employs some of the same job skills to convey career information. The Careerfest site has information about several broadcast careers including Broadcast Sound Technician, News Reporter and Director.

The station also hosted tours of the station and gave presentations for various community groups and schools that highlight what the station does for the community as well the various jobs and careers in broadcasting.

The station participates in various job banks and outreach newsletters of media trade groups whose membership includes substantial participation of women and minorities, such as PBS Connect, CPB website, St. Phillips College, Palo Alto College and San Antonio College.

Additionally, the station sends various personnel to a variety of training seminars and conferences that enables staff to acquire skills that can qualify them for higher positions. During the last year some of the conferences attended by personnel were: PBS Technology Conference, NAB, TAB, Integrated Media Association Conference, IDRA, NAEYC, TCEA, NAEYC, NECC, San Antonio Counsel of Alcohol and Drug Abuse, Parent Institute, and a Diversity Conference.

The station is participating in an internship program with the Corporation for Public Broadcasting and The Emma Bowen Foundation. The station has an intern from the program that will work in several departments over five summers. During this past year the intern worked in our Public Relations department. In addition, the station has an internship program available that places college students in several department areas through out the station. The program requires that the student get college credit for participation.
